Monarch Butterfly Walk

Every year the Monarch Butterfly flies thousands of miles back to the same trees at the San Leandro Marina to spend the winter. The City of San Leandro sponsors the Monarch Butterfly Walks to share this exceptional program.

Join the AAUW, Hayward-Castro Valley Branch for a special guided walk by Naturalist Adrienne De Ponte on Thursday, November 10th at 2:00 PM at 13800 Monarch Bay Drive. Meet in the parking lot in front of the green double-decker driving range.

After a brief talk we will take a short walk to see the monarch butterflies clustered on the Eucalyptus trees. Be sure to wear comfortable shoes as we'll walk two, flat blocks on paved surfaces, then on grass to view the butterflies. Bring your binoculars to get the best views!
