PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

I would like to wish all of you a HAPPY NEW YEAR!!

We all strive to make each year more meaningful in our lives and our AAUW is doing it's best to make your year more interesting as well as fun.

We are starting off with our favorite luncheon at Sunol Golf Club. This is the time for us to honor one of the women who has received a National AAUW Fellowship. This year Joanne da Luz was chosen to be our speaker. She is the recipient of a Career Development Fellowship Grant. This is an award given to a woman who has already received her bachelor's degree and is interested in changing her career. She will speak on February 2nd to an audience of three branches: Hayward/Castro Valley, Livermore/Pleasanton/Dublin, and Fremont. The latest research report from AAUW National is "Graduating to the Pay Gap". This report came out in October and the printing was funded by the Mooneen Lecce Giving Circle. A number of members of our branch support this circle by pooling their contributions to fund projects of our choice benefiting women and girls. The money is held by the National AAUW Foundation and has been used for a number of years to fund the printing and dissemination of the research reports from National AAUW. This latest report finds that women are paid less than men in nearly every occupation. Because pay equity affects women and their families in all walks of life, it is not surprising that many women consider the issue important. The gap shows that women one year out of college who are working full time earned, on average, just 82 percent of what their male peers earned. A recent newspaper article showed that the MBA pay gap has returned. In 2002 women at the top 30 MBA programs earned 98 percent of what men earned. That fell to 94 percent in 2004 and now is down to 93 percent. Women's careers lag behind men from day one. This has great implications for their entire career and on into retirement.

Report: California Bay Area Schools Fall Short of Title IX Compliance

Local NBC news <u>reported</u> in November 2012 that numerous schools in the San Francisco Bay Area have failed to appoint Title IX coordinators to handle harassment and discrimination complaints on the basis of sex. Title IX requires schools to appoint a coordinator and make the coordinator's name and contact information publicly available. The NBC reporters sent a simple email to over 200 Bay Area school principals asking for the contact information of their Title IX coordinator. Of the few that replied, most schools said they did not know who was appointed the Title IX coordinator; some were unaware of what Title IX was. Equal Rights Advocates, a national nonprofit, has followed up with the school districts and could file a complaint with the Department of Education.

AAUW strongly <u>supports</u> Title IX and opposes any efforts that would weaken its effectiveness or undermine its enforcement. The AAUW 2011-2013 Public Policy Program "...advocates vigorous enforcement of Title IX and all other civil rights laws pertaining to education."

You can also name AAUW as the beneficiary of your life insurance, bank account, stock account, or retirement plan. In addition to bequests in your will or living trust, charitable gift annuities are available that can provide you with tax savings and income during your lifetime.
