AAUW ANNUITY

Are you aware that **AAUW has an Annuity Program** where you can get more interest than in a normal fund type of investment. Once you establish this annuity, you will be paid the same amount no matter what the stock market does. The older you are when you establish your annuity, the higher your payment rate. You can leave a legacy by establishing an annuity supporting the AAUW Educational Foundation, Legal Advocacy Fund, or Association Leadership and Training Institute. I did this a number of years ago and receive four equal payments each year. The payment rates now are as follows: Age 65=6.0%, 70=6.5%, 75=7.1%, 80=8.0%, 90+=11.3%. My step mother took \$300,000 out of Franklin Fund which was paying her 4%. She is 99 and receives the maximum every four months. This is really necessary as she has caregivers and needs cash flow. When she dies, the remainder of her Annuity will become an American Fellowship in her name. If you want more information, call AAUW at 202-728-7627. Liz Bathgate
