## PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE



This past month I was able to spend a Saturday with a group of League of Women Voters to hear about the best way to go about raising funds for non-profits. The words that stood out the most from the lecture were the demographics of the different generations. As we all know the Baby Boomers born from 1946 – 1964 are a very large group. They are followed by the Gen X group from 1964 – 1981. There were far fewer babies born in that generation and the consequences for non-profit organizations is that there will not be enough money to keep all of them in business.

AAUW is near and dear to me and the thought that it could disappear is beyond my belief. For that reason, I am working with our National AAUW as Northern California's Legacy Circle chair. In that capacity, I am encouraging members to include AAUW in their trusts. In addition, I encourage those of us who are 70 ½ to consider gifting to AAUW some or all of your Required Minimum Distribution. By doing this, you will save yourself having to pay taxes on this distribution. Making a rollover gift from your retirement account is easy. A simple letter is all you need to instruct your IRA administrator to transfer your gift.

These past three years we have been funding our Tech Trek girls mainly from donations from the Bonnie Smith Trust. When she died of cancer, she left her home and main assets to National AAUW, but the money in her bank account has been used to fund Tech Trek and Scholarships. That money will run out this year and if we want to continue sending so many deserving 7<sup>th</sup> grade girls to science camp we will have to make up that difference. Tech Trek through SPF is a 501c3 entity and as such can receive funds that are tax deductible. If you decide to write a check from these funds, you need to make the check out to SPF and in the memo line put Tech Trek. Send these checks to Judy Harrison at 25319 Morse Court, Hayward, CA 94542.

This spring, in order to raise more funds for Tech Trek, we are planning a family Music/Magic Show. One of our members, Daphne Butler sings with this group and helps in the magic show.
