Case Support

LAF is pleased to report the adoption of a new case: **Foltz et al. v. Delaware State University.** Fifteen members of the Delaware State University (DSU) women's equestrian team filed this lawsuit to challenge the school's decision to eliminate the team and replace it with competitive cheerleading. The suit, which alleges that the school failed to provide equal athletic opportunities to DSU's female students, has been approved as a class action. LAF is disbursing \$11,500 to the Women's Law Project, the Philadelphia organization that represents the students, to bring an expert witness to the October trial.
