## PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Hello Members.

I'm just back from the CA Convention in Irvine. It was a wonderful experience full of opportunities to network; learn how other branches assist the women and girls in their communities; how they work with like-minded organizations; and handle fundraising. I came home with good ideas we can implement right here, right now:

- (1) Develop a Power Map to help us be more efficient in finding advocates/partners in our community to help support our mission;
- (2) Utilize new, innovative resources to expand awareness of AAUW and our highlight our fantastic work; and
- (3) Update out Branch Facebook page with new pictures, text, and a secure Group sight for members only.

I loved that the program chair brought in speakers from like-minded organizations to speak about their programs. **Let It Ripple** uses film, technology, discussion materials, and live and virtual events to engage people in conversation and action. Their short film, 50/50 Day, shown at convention, discusses gender equity over a 100,000-year lifespan. Their films and discussion materials are free for our use.

The Joan Kroc Institute for Peace and Justice at the University of San Diego sent three fabulous women from the **Women Peacemakers Program and Network**, consisting of 1000 women peacemakers from conflict areas around the globe, to talk about how they are working to end cycles of violence. Their research and You Tube videos are available for branches to use as well.



AAUW CEO Kimberley Churches spoke about her assessment of the future of AAUW and why the National Board is proposing three bylaw amendments for a vote. The proposed amendments address: (1) creating three-year staggered board terms; (2) opening board service to those outside of the AAUW membership; and (3) eliminating the degree requirement for membership.

Ms. Churches stated the changes will keep AAUW vital as an organization and enable AAUW to increase our impact in advancing equity for women and girls. The State Board of Directors has also endorsed the proposed amendments. Now it's your turn to make your voice heard.

On April 25<sup>th</sup> all members with a valid email address received their voter PIN.
