Stand Up for the Freedom to Vote!

In 2021, three bills were introduced in Congress aimed at establishing national standards to make sure every voter can participate in elections in 2021. The For the People Act (H.R.1) and the bipartisan John Lewis Voting Rights Advancement Act (H.R.4) both passed the U.S. House of Representatives but stalled in the U.S. Senate. Key Senate leaders then worked on a compromise: the Freedom to Vote Act (S. 2747). By the end of 2021, this also stalled. On January 13, the House consolidated two of the bills and passed the new **Freedom to Vote: John R. Lewis Act of 2022.** The bill package is now under consideration with

the Senate. Contact your Congressional representatives. Let them know you support the freedom to vote.

History is the focus for the **bountiful legacy of \$85,000 from lifetime member Patricia Ball**. Your Board met this week with the heads of the Cal State University of the East Bay (CSUEB) history department to finalize the endowment of \$40,000 to fund local scholarships in perpetuity. The CSUEB team speculates the endowment will generate a scholarship of \$1,500 per year by 2024. It is very exciting to move forward with this exciting option.

The remaining \$45,000 will be invested and used for mission-based programs and events. A follow-up meeting to discuss usage will be scheduled. Stay tuned.

The AAUW California board of directors made the decision that the Tech Trek program will always include a state-wide virtual camp option with a standardized curriculum. In other words, the board endorsed having a single type of virtual camp instead of versions at each site. The board felt the advantages of a standardized virtual camp were consistency of the camp experience, more efficient use of resources, more manageable volunteer requirements, a unified presence for donors, and avoiding unnecessary duplication of effort.

It is not the board's intention that the virtual option will ever replace our beloved residential camps. But, for 2022, our traditional program will be dependent on campus availability and, of course, the state of the pandemic. We are certainly working hard to host residential camps but are grateful to have a virtual alternative with a volunteer to direct it.

The curriculum of the standardized virtual camp is still being developed and it is hoped that our Tech Trek stakeholders will contribute their talents to enhancing the experience we were able to offer in 2021.
