Born in Casablanca, Morocco, Amal ElWardi is currently an MFA candidate at Saint Mary's College of California, cultivating relative practice in somatic education. Somatic education is a simple process of neuromuscular re-education that allows you to regain voluntary control of all the muscles of your body so that optimal muscle function and comfort can be restored, and then maintained, for the long term. When we have full control of our muscles, they will not cause pain. Her goal is to deconstruct patriarchal, codified pedagogies, and implement the consciousness of direct experience for enhanced comprehension and creation of knowledge, specially within the frameworks of ideokinesis, an approach to improving posture, alignment, and fluency of movement through structured guided imagery, and somatization.

Evening Book Group

The Evening Book Group will meet on **Wednesday**, **January 18**, **2023**, **at 6:30 PM** on Zoom.

The group will be discussing the banned graphic novel **MAUS** by cartoonist Art Spiegelman. Serialized from 1980 to 1991, It depicts Spiegelman interviewing his father about his experiences as a Polish Jew and Holocaust survivor.

The work employs postmodern techniques and represents Jews as mice and other Germans and Poles as cats and pigs. Critics have classified *Maus* as memoir, biography, history, fiction, autobiography, or a mix of genres.

In 1992 it became the first graphic novel to win a Pulitzer Prize. In 2015 Russia banned the graphic novel for use of a modified swastika on the cover and in 2022 the Tennessee school board banned the graphic novel due to inappropriate language and an illustration of a nude woman.

Elections Finally Over - How'd We Do in '22?

The election is finally over! In addition to an end to the non-stop requests for donations, AAUW members can be pretty happy with the results. Here are a few highlights:

- 1 woman each was added to the U.S. House and the U.S. Senate, bringing the numbers to 124 (H) and 25 (S)
- Of the total of 149, 54 are women of color
- We lost the most powerful woman in government (Nancy Pelosi) but still have a woman on the Minority leadership team, Minority Whip Katherine Clark
- Governors of 12 states are now women
- 23% of all mayors across the nation are women, including our brand new and first female mayor of Los Angeles, Karen Bass
- 20 women won new seats in the California Legislature and 30 female incumbents were re-elected, bringing the total to 50 but still just 42%
- All executive positions in California except Governor are filled by women, including Secretary of State, Lieutenant Governor, Treasurer, and Controller, as well as the Senate Pro Tem
- Proposition 1 prevailed and women's right to control their own reproductive choices is now enshrined in our constitution.

And here are some fun facts:

- Only 3.2% of all members of Congress to date have been women
- California has sent more women to Congress than any other state a total of 47 to date
- Vermont is the only state that has never sent a woman to either the House or the Senate

The State Public Policy committee thanks each and every AAUW California member who voted, who assisted in our Voter Education (VE) campaign by spreading our messages on social media, who took the pledge to vote for Prop 1 (we had 437 sign up!) and who worked within their branches to do their own VE events.
