

The Book Group will meet on **Wednesday**, **February 14**, **2023**, **at 3:30 PM** on Zoom. We will discuss **"The Chocolate War"** by Robert Cormier.

The Chocolate War is a 1974 young adult novel by American writer Robert Cormier. It was adapted into a film in 1988.

Although it received mixed reviews at the time of its publication, some reviewers have argued it is one of the best young adult novels of all time.

Set at a fictional Catholic high school, the story depicts a secret student organization's manipulation of the student body, which descends into cruel and ugly mob mentality against a lone, non-conforming student.

Because of the novel's language, the concept of a high school secret society using intimidation to enforce the cultural norms of the school and various characters' sexual ponderings, it has been embroiled in censorship controversies and appeared as third on the American Library Association's list of the Top 100 Banned/Challenged Books in 2000–2009.

Abraham Lincoln Sixteenth President, 1809 - 1865

There's a lot to celebrate in February. There's Valentine's Day, the birthdays of two presidents, Lunar New Year, and it is Black History Month. When I think of Black history, I give credit to our sixteenth president for the emancipation proclamation (in addition to future struggles, this is where freedom began).

Lincoln's legacy is based on his momentous achievements: he successfully waged a political struggle and civil war that preserved the Union, ended slavery, Linda for Zoom information.

All branch members are encouraged to attend board meetings.

AAUW advances equity for women and girls through advocacy, education and research. and created the possibility of civil and social freedom for African Americans. However, his assassination prevented him from overseeing the reconstruction of the Union he had helped save. The assassination also had the effect of turning Lincoln into a martyr of almost mythological dimensions. As Edwin Stanton remarked when Lincoln died, "Now he belongs to the ages." It is much more realistic to see Lincoln as a practical genius. Temperamentally, he was humane, tolerant, and patient. Be he also had an extraordinary ability to see events clearly and adapt to them responding decisively when necessary. Above all, there is his evolution on civil rights. He began the Civil War with thoughts only of restoring the Union but ended up committing the nation to freedom for African Americans.

Training materials on the bills and the event will be posted on the state website in mid-March, and a mandatory training webinar will be held on **March 25, 2024, at 3 PM**. Lobby Days provide a wonderful opportunity to meet with your legislators and advocate for legislation to promote gender equity and improve the lives of women and girls.
